### Cycle tourism at a glance

**Cycling trips | 3+ nights** Cycling as main trip motive



Cycling trips | 1–2 nights

No cycling trips No cycling trips in 2023 or the past three years



Cycling while on holiday New Different main trip motive, but cycled while on holiday

Day trips by bike Trips during free time (not while on holiday), without any overnight stays

## Estimated total spending

The respondents' estimates of their spending can be used to calculate the total spending for the individual cycle tourism segments. Accordingly, the total spending for the individual segments was as follows in 2023:



€14–15 billion spent on day trips



€2–3 billion spent on short cycling trips



€6–7 billion spent on cycling trips with 3+ nights

### Outlook

What are your cycling plans for 2024?



Reference: German population; n = 1,042 (multiple answers for the first three options)



The longer the cycling trip, the greater the motivation to cycle more in everyday life

- Every second cycle tourist (3+ nights) cycles more often in their everyday life after their cycling trip. This figure has risen slightly compared to the previous year.
- Among the cyclists to go on a short cycling trip, 41.8% cycled more in their everyday life after their cycling trip.

### Conclusions

- 1. More than half of the population of Germany cycles while on holiday and/or during day trips.
- 2. Spending on cycling holidays and cycling while on holiday tends to be above average.
- 3. In 2023, there were fewer cycling trips but more day trips than in the previous year.
- 4. Overall, people are (very) satisfied with their cycling holidays. To ensure this remains the case, the cycle tourism infrastructure must continue to be developed and investments must be made in quality. All cycle tourism stakeholders must also cooperate.
- 5. Cycle tourists' plans for 2024 give hope for growth in all segments.
